TEM 2.0

In the last quartile, the biggest changes in education were probably the online classes and the 1.5-meter classes and exams on campus. Due to these, you might have missed the implementation of the Twente Education Model 2.0. This means that instead of receiving a fixed amount of 15 EC for successfully completing a module, with the old model, you will now receive a set amount of EC for successfully completing a study unit.

- Study unit: the entirety of study unit components, bundled into one unit, you have to successfully pass to receive the EC's that are listed for it on Osiris.
- Study unit component (= "part of study unit" and also called "course"): a component of a study unit. This can be one or several components per study unit.

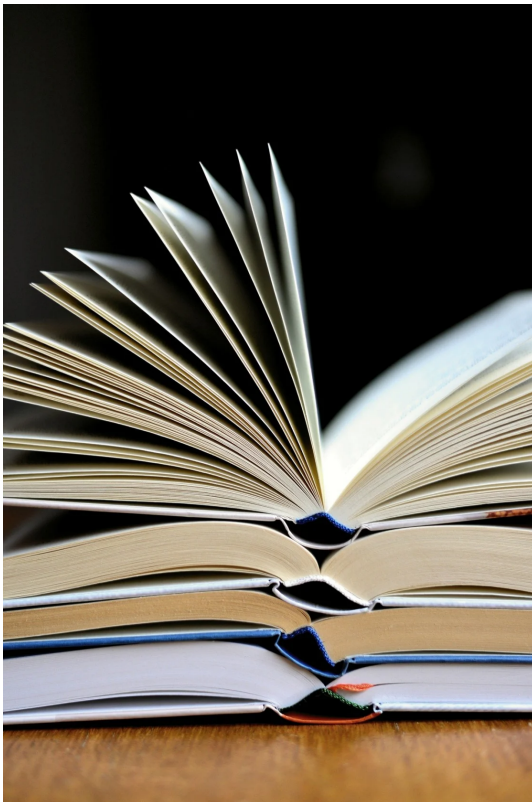
Each programme is free to determine how study units are composed so for a complete overview check your Canvas programme page or mail your study advisor.

Sell your books back to Studystore

Do you also have your old study books lying around, gathering dust? You can make room for new ones by selling them back to Studystore. To find out what your books are worth, go to [this website](#) and fill out the ISBN. When you decide to sell your books, a document with address information will be sent to you in order to send the books to Studystore for free. The values of each book differ but are usually around €25 to €35 per book. Once they have received the book, you will receive the money within seven days. Keep in mind that they do not need all books and, therefore, it is not always possible to sell back

your old books to Studystore.
